#### Letter from Pastor Dana

Advent is a time to celebrate an extraordinary birth. A birth that changed all of creation. It is one where the trees dance. The animals rejoice. The stars shine. The oceans flow. Why are they in a stable? Because the government drove them to Bethlehem for a census... can you imagine being fully pregnant about to give birth and now you have to travel on the back of a donkey thanks to Caesar Augustus?

The only place to lay their newborn is in a feeding trough. Luckily they had some clothes to swaddle around him before laying him in a manger. Christmas comes from humble beginnings. The humble beginnings have turned into a chaotic cooking and money spending reality. We are anticipating our honored traditions of this time. We want Christmas to be perfect. But what is perfect? There is only one thing that is perfect. Christ. In the midst of an unperfect messy world Christ breaks into creation. This is an extraordinary birth.

So, in the midst of high expectations, pain, fear, worry, final exams, loss of job, moving, divorce, deep mourning of loved ones we continue to light candles. One after another.
