- In mid-May, Dave Simon, Pr. Dana and I attended the annual Synod Assembly in Grand Rapids. This was my first time at the assembly as a voting member, and it was really interesting to see the processes and passion of our synod! Next year the assembly will be held in Mt. Pleasant, and as members of the synod, anyone is invited to be present for most of the sessions, although only voting members are allowed to participate in the voting, and most discussion points.
- 2. I am excited as we move to the single summer service. We are an active, thriving church. We have diversity, in many ways (age, socio-economic status, education). We have members with talents beyond compare! We're fortunate that we've got such diverse tastes and talents in music. Our members are truly dedicated to making Immanuel the best that it could possibly be!!! We are busy (just look at all the sign-up sheets in the Narthex). Reformation 500

REFORMATION 500

Next year Lutherans around the world celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The ELCA and our Synod are encouraging congregations to recognize this event. I am gathering resources and information to assist you and Immanuel in recognizing this event.

Andreas Teich has been gathering resources for our Synod's Reformation 500 efforts for a year and the Synod's website <u>www.mittensynod.org</u> (under the Events tab, click on Reformation 500) is very comprehensive. Andreas will update this website throughout the year so I suggest you keep checking it.

Several people have suggested that we take a trip to Germany to follow in Luther's footsteps. Several opportunities are available. Our synod-sponsored tour will be May 1-12, 2017. It is an Ecumenical Pilgrimage to the Lands of Luther and Italy. Information on this trip is available at the Synod website <u>www.mittensynod.org</u>. This tour will fill up quickly so you need to act fast if you're interested. If this trip doesn't work for you, Faith Journeys in Tempe, AZ at http://myfaithjourneys.com/protestant_germany.html also has several trips planned.

Interested in travel, but not interested in traveling to Europe? Consider attending the Grace Gathering in New Orleans. The Grace Gathering will be held concurrently with the Churchwide Assembly (August 10 – August 13). This is your opportunity to experience the ELCA as it gathers in the Churchwide assembly, to learn about the ELCA ministries and to attend workshops and presentations that focus on Reformation history and relevance, planning local observances, as well as connecting the Lutheran witness to our lives today. Workshops titles include: What Does It Mean to Be Lutheran in a Multi-religious World? Lutheran-Jewish Relations, Lutheran-Muslim Relations, The Lutheran Witness: What Does This Mean?, and The 95 Theses and Other Key Reformation Documents. Do you want to learn more about Luther's readings? Join in the <u>Luther Reading Challenge</u>. (<u>www.lutherreadingchallenge.org/</u>) Sign up for a free account and join readers around the world in reading, discussing and reflecting on Luther's important writings. Each text begins with an introduction, giving its context and key themes. You can add marginal comments, respond to others' remarks, and raise your own questions. You can also tailor your own profile to share and connect with others.
