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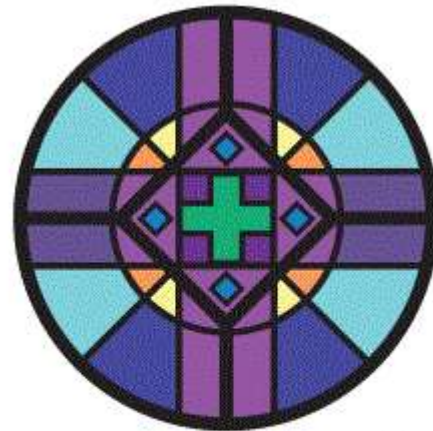

MEETING

There will be a CONGREGATIONAL MEETING on Sunday February 18th in between services to gain congregational input and support for a potential 2019 sabbatical for Pastor Dana.

A Letter from Pr. Dana.....

Friends in Christ,

I entered 2018 truly humbled by the congregation's vigor and outpouring of support for the ministry and mission of Immanuel. This was made evident by the faithful energy surrounding the celebration of Jesus among us and the gracious offerings that came through our unified budget and our capital campaign, "Over the Hill and Still Moving Mountains." I am excited to share that through the campaign we have pledged a total of \$149,000! I fall to my knees in thanksgiving and rise to my feet with joy for the ways we will invigorate our facilities, resources, and ministries starting in 2018.

The first step with the campaign was to put in a new projection system. As you likely already know it is up and running! It has a lot of potential to enhance worship visually and for outreach through web streaming. We are learning quickly we need a dedicated and knowledgeable leader to use all the new bells and whistles well.

Alongside, upgrading our facilities I feel God has put it on my heart to really look into how our worship is reaching the younger generations, especially the contemporary service. It has long been the goal of the contemporary service to reach out to young families. We have seen some growth, but it is always healthy to re-evaluate so we are always making the focus on reaching God's children who are yet to come and worship with us.

It has been my hope that one day the contemporary service enthusiasts grow to the point we can't do just one service in the summer! In this New Year we will envision with the millennials and young families and see what they want in a service. We will discuss moving the service location so it seems more intimate and full of life. We will evaluate the flow of the service with music and word.

To do this effectively, I need to recognize my limitations as your leader. I have suggested to the Worship Ministry Team, Tech Team, Council and Personnel that I'd like to work with a paid staff member who can really help me to form and shape a Lutheran Liturgical Contemporary Service. It was approved at council in January that personnel begin a process to possibly hire someone for both contemporary music and projection in the coming months.

I look forward to seeing what happens and pray that God leads us through this process so that we may become more and more into a church, an assembly that reveals God's love to those who have yet to hear and know God's grace.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In any healthy relationship, personal growth of each individual is just as important as the growth of the relationship itself. In fact, the relationship can plateau if the individuals involved are not growing and developing in their own lives. While we were still dating, Kathy and I spent a year apart as she attended Luther College in Iowa. We both look back on that year apart as one of the best things to happen in developing our relationship. Being apart crystallized what was important in our relationship. We came back together as new people because of our experiences, and recommitted to our relationship because we understood how important it was (and is) to each of us.

And so it is with the pastor and their church. Every now and again the pastor needs some time away to recharge their battery and focus on their own growth. Pr. Dana has brought to Council the application for a grant from the Lilly Endowment for Clergy Renewal, for the purposes of funding a 2019 sabbatical for her and which would also provide the funds for the stand-in pastor for Immanuel. The general recommendation is that a pastor take a sabbatical about every seven years. 2018 marks Pr. Dana's seventh year at Immanuel, so it is indeed about time for a recharging. The grant procedure will help focus Pr. Dana on how she wants to help herself during her sabbatical of three or four months; but it also asks us as a congregation what we might do to renew and redirect our energies during her absence. For that, we will need your input and ideas. Another critical requirement in consideration of awarding the grant is that we "provide evidence of broad congregational support" for Pr. Dana taking her sabbatical. To assess congregational support before we commit to beginning this application process, THERE WILL BE A CONGREGATIONAL MEETING BETWEEN SERVICES February 18th to discuss this, to answer any questions you might have and get an idea of the degree of support we have for a sabbatical. Please plan to attend – everyone's input is critical.
