Family Conversations

Eye Spark

Look for beautiful things that God has created and say their names out loud. Do you know the scientific names of those beautiful things?



Ear Spark

When you hear an animal make a sound (like barking or squawking or mooing) give thanks to God for making such an animal.

LIVE IT

For families to do together

Go for a nature hike or a walk around your neighborhood. Take a bag to collect any litter you see as you go. Make a note of things in nature that you do not know the specific names of - certain flowers or birds or trees. When you get home, do a little research and see if you can learn some new names.

For younger kids
