LIVE IT

For families to do together

Daniel prayed three times a day. Find three times during the day to pray together as a family: before or after meals, when you wake up, at nap-time, or before bed. Try some new ways of praying like singing, dancing, or drawing a prayer. Explore prayer together!

For older kids

Find the sound of lion roars on the internet. Turn up your speakers! Is it scary? Play it back for yourself whenever you feel afraid of something. Know that God is with you.
