The ICRH is a vital service to those looking for shelter and a place to rest all year long, but the need is more urgent in winter. Immanuel will be hosting ICRH guests the week of February 16th. I encourage you all to participate in some way, working a shift, supplying food for a meal, helping move & transport supplies from/to Immanuel... Any way we can make our guests feel welcome and safe will be much appreciated.

A middle school youth after school program on Wednesdays was started this past fall. They use the time to help out with projects around the church, to help prepare for Worship Wednesday, and to learn & grow in Christ. Thank you to Craig for leading this group and effort!

In recent years we've enjoyed the service of interns, and we will again be bringing two interns on board. One will be focusing their efforts on technology and how to best utilize our systems, the other will focus their efforts on early childhood development and the nursery.

Many changes have been made to Immanuel since the start of our capital campaign. The updated and improved narthex/welcome center, new display monitors, the new parent room to name a few. One of the last projects is nearing completion with final touches being made over the next several weeks is the youth room. Renovations should be completed by mid-February. I encourage you to take a look. This room is in the far northwest corner of the church. It will be a fantastic room for the youth to use and enjoy soon. Thank you to all members who are making this happen!

A Letter from the Director of Faith Formation....

Happy February!

Which means...we are only one month into the new year?! There has been so much that has happened so far!

Thank you all for giving me an opportunity to give the sermon at the beginning of the new year. I was actually able to use some of that material during Worship Wednesday when one of the kids asked how Jesus knew Zacchaeus' name. The discussion ended up exploring things like Jesus being fully God and that God is omnipotent and omnipresent. It is fun to see the wheels turning as our kids think through these things. Plus, they always have such great questions and ideas themselves.

The youth room has come a long way. Our goal is to have is finished by February 15th. There will always be additions like adding pictures, technology, etc. but this date marks when we would like to start inviting students into the room for programming & fun. In January we were able to get the stadium seating and restaurant seating carpeted, get the curved plywood base on the face of the snack booth, refinished the table legs for the restaurant booth area, get the countertops glued up and shaped, started painting the inside of the window trim, and have new cellular shades ready to put in the windows when that paint dries. All of that to say...a lot has been accomplished! I love taking people through the room to give them the vision of what we are trying to do. If you are interested in helping work on the room or would like a tour, please let me know.

This last weekend in January/ first in February is the ELCA Extravaganza in Anaheim, CA. The Extravaganza is an annual gathering of children, youth and family ministry leaders from across the ELCA. We sent Beth Mundwiler, who faithfully serves our middle and high school youth, to connect with these other leaders in our denomination and learn and collaborate about different ways we can serve our children, youth, and young adults. I was not able to go this year but this event is always a great way to renew, get educated, and connect with other leaders in our denomination. We really appreciate the ability to send leaders to the ELCA Extravaganza every year.

At the end of 2019 we reapplied for an ELCA campus ministry grant. This is a mission outreach grant through the synod that helps fund outreach to college campuses. We just received word that we received this grant again! In the past this has helped fund my position to serve in campus ministry, help us purchase materials for college small groups, fund care packages, take college students to Memphis over spring break for a mission trip, and most recently take on two interns for this spring 2020 semester.
