

A Letter from Pr. Dana....

Friends in Christ,

The reality that we are not gathering together on Easter morning has hit me hard. I love all the energy, the music that fills the air, the seats of the church being filled, the beautiful lilies and their fragrance, the crisp air at the sunrise service when we gather outside to hear, "Were you There." I love the joy in the air as everyone gathers around a pancake breakfast together. I love seeing all the beautiful dresses and dapper gentleman. I love your voices shouting in joy, "Christ is risen indeed, alleluia." People often joke that I must go home from Easter services and need a nap.
