A Letter from Pr. Dana....

Dear Friends in Christ,

At the annual meeting on September 19, I prayed, "Come with a fire that refines, Water that refreshes, Wind that topples, Breath that fills...Come, Holy Spirit, and restore your Church." I have a strong feeling that to be a church with a refining flame and wind that topples—we cannot do things as we have always done them. A fire requires the breath of the Spirit, continuous care, attention, and new logs. If you have ever sat at a campfire and admired the flames, while they stay the same and offer warmth and beauty for a time, eventually you need a new log. You can think of these logs as our ministries and people. Things change/adapt/evolve with every new log in a fire, and things are a changing around here.

We can celebrate that we've offered this community a Thanksgiving Dinner on Thanksgiving Day for the past 30+ years. We even did it in 2020, which is pretty miraculous in and of itself. God has used us to touch so many people's lives! While we are not offering a Thanksgiving Dinner for the community in 2021, we do have a team of people doing research on the current need for this service. In 2021, this community has a soup kitchen which provides a Thanksgiving meal and a food pantry (CCN) which hands out turkeys and all the fixings. It is sad to pause this ministry we so dearly love. Yet, it is time for it to become a new log. We may be renewing the ministry in 2022 or God may surprise us with another need to meet.

Speaking of new things, we're getting three new staff members! Leadership has decided that for one year, we will hire temporary part-time staff to give us time to work towards a new and exciting opportunity for staffing. Please be sure to watch for announcements on who the new hires are and welcome them with the love of Christ: The Children's Ministry Coordinator, The Youth Ministry Coordinator/Tech Guru, and a Faith In Action Coordinator.

The new and exciting opportunity for the future is to become a part of seminary training for ELCA pastors. We have been approved as a site to receive what the church calls a Vicar. Think of a student teacher or medical residency. In this gleaner, we have included detailed information on what a Vicar is and what becoming a part of seminary training means for our congregation. We will be having lots of conversations about the details this year. I hope all of us get involved!

This letter is an invitation to stay alert to the work of the Spirit among us and the fire that God is igniting. Let our church be a beacon of Christ's light in the world. Rekindle the flame within us.

What is a Vicar?

Internship is an integral part of seminary training for ELCA pastors. At most seminaries, the seminarian spends a full year with a congregation in the third year of their four-year program. During this internship, the student learns what happens on a day-to-day basis in a congregation. They practice some of what they have learned in the classroom. Much like a medical residency or student teaching, an internship puts into action the theories that have been studied.

While in our midst, the intern is called "vicar." The vicar will be involved in all aspects of worship except celebrating communion. They will preach regularly as *preaching is one of the most important opportunities on internship*. The vicar will also be involved in the education program teaching both confirmation students and an adult class. The vicar will visit the sick and the homebound. The vicar will complete a project, of their choice, during their year with us. The vicar and I will regularly meet to review how they are growing in their pastoral identity.

What does that mean for the rest of us?

As a member of Immanuel, your role is to provide feedback to the vicar so that they gain a sense of how their ministry is received. "Good sermon, Vicar" is a nice compliment but does not provide insight into why the proclamation struck a chord. The vicar's preaching will be different from mine and offer the congregation diversity in stories, perspective, and ways to hear the Word. It will be a gift for our community. After all, many of you have been listening to me for over 10 years already!

In addition to informal feedback from all our members, eight members of the congregation serve as the internship committee. They provide primary support and formal evaluation for the intern. The committee also serves as an avenue for you to provide more feedback. The committee may indeed seek feedback from you! They will also plan a "welcome party" and a "sending party." That's right, more reason to celebrate together!

Once we celebrate the vicar's year with us, they are sent back to seminary for their final year of school. Following that year, they will enter a process for first call and once they receive a call, they will be ordained.

How much do you pay them?

The cost to participate as an internship site runs anywhere from \$35,000-\$45,000. For example:

- Stipend paid directly to student (taxable): \$1,800/month X 12 months \$21,600.00
- Administrative/tuition fee paid to seminary (one-time cost): \$ 1,000.00
- Travel fee paid to seminary (one-time cost) & then to student according to distance traveled to internship site: \$
 500.00
- Housing including gas, electricity, cable/internet, water, garbage (taxable, but we ask the internship site to cover this tax for the student): *Market value in your area*
- The Housing must be fully furnished (kitchen, bedroom, living room...)
- Cost for student & supervisor to attend area Cluster Meetings: Varies (e.g., tuition, travel, lodging)
- Mileage reimbursement expenses for church business: IRS Rate

Why would we do this?

My dream is to become a congregation that is well known in the internship process, a place where students want to be the lucky one assigned to us! The place I interned, Trinity Lutheran Bradenton, FL, is on their 23^{rd} intern. My first call, Christus Victor Lutheran, Naples, FL, is also on their 23^{rd} intern. Our Bishop, Craig Satterlee, did his internship at Trinity Lutheran in Midland, MI. Messiah Lutheran, Bay City, MI, accepted an intern this year because of a geographical restriction. In Michigan, we have a unique opportunity to become a long-standing site, similar to the Florida sites where I was blessed to do ministry.

It is an opportunity for us to be a blessing to the Church and for the vicars to be a blessing to us. In my first call, I loved how our vicars changed from year-to-year. There was new excitement, and they each connected closely with different members. I look forward to discussing this opportunity more at our annual meeting.



Refugee Help

LIRS Support of Afghan Refugees For two decades, the U.S. Government has employed Afghan allies to serve alongside U.S. Troops, diplomats, and other government employees as interpreters, translators, cultural advisors, drivers, and more. More than 18,000 Afghans who served alongside them face a severe backlog in the processing of their Special Immigrant Visas (SIVs). LIRS has taken the lead in resettling our Afghan allies and their families and is currently looking for assistance in supporting these refugees in Western Michigan.

How can I help?

Samaritas is organizing the resettlement of refugees in Western Michigan. They have expressed a need for housing options for refugee families to Western Michigan. Options can either be temporary/transitional or permanent. They are looking for both 1/2/3 bedroom apartments and larger single family homes.

Other supplies for families, such as house furnishings and supplies for babies and young children, are also needed. Monetary donations are also being accepted and will support rental homes or apartments. If you are interested in supporting this ministry, have housing leads, or items to donate, please contact Chris Cavanaugh, Samaritas' Director of New American Resettlement for Western Michigan at ccava@samaritas.org.

Did you know you can update your own photos and information on the online directory?


Please take a few moments this month to update the directory with a new photo of your family. Also, check your personal information and update if needed.

This can be done through the app on your phone or through your computer online.



- 2. Your personal profile







Step two: Click on your profile




Step three: Click on change photo and then upload new photo




Step four: Click on choose a photo




Step five: Find a photo on your computer and click on it




Step six: Position the photo you just uploaded




Step seven: Make sure you stretch the box to fit the photo




Step eight: Click update




Step nine: Scroll down and click on your personal profile
