

A letter from Pastor Dana...

Friends in Christ,

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen, Indeed! Alleluia!

It was such a lovely, joyous Easter AND spring is finally showing up. I am grateful to share with you that this Lent you gave more than the goal of \$2,000 to help with aid in the Ukraine. We'll be sending over \$4,490.25 when including the matching funds from our Mission Endowment! We also raised \$591 at the Easter breakfast to help the youth on their mission trip. And on May 8, we get to celebrate Beth Mundwiler doing youth ministry with us for 25 years! Bring your party hats!

On the business side of things, please hold Beth Mundwiler, Ted Tuma, and I in prayer during the annual synod assembly on May 14. I have also received official notice that we will not be getting a vicar in the 2022-2023 year. I was blessed to have interviewed two lovely students out of the three total who were able to leave the Chicagoland area. I was grateful that two of them wanted to interview with us, but perhaps Mt. Pleasant, Michigan, doesn't quite have the same ring to it as Texas, Maine, or Florida. Council and the personnel committee will discuss further (considering financials too) as to if we want to try again for the 2023-24 year. I am disappointed, but I also know that God is leading us, and we're along for the ride!

I pray you enjoy this spring and get out into God's creation as often as the weather allows. Every time you feel the warmth of that sun-remember just how much God loves you!

Contributing Stocks or Bonds

To contribute capital gain property such as stocks or bonds to the church, per IRS Publication 526 you can deduct the Fair Market Value of the asset on your personal tax returns - not the basis in the asset. Immanuel has a brokerage account to facilitate the transfer of these assets directly. If you are interested, please contact the church for information or assistance.

Tax Break for Contributions -people over 70 1/2 years-old

If you are over 70.5 did you know that you can give directly from your retirement account to Immanuel Lutheran Church and pay no taxes on the gift? Due to the tax changes that include a higher standard deduction and the elimination of the personal exemption, you may receive the best tax benefit if you donate directly from your retirement account.

Ted explained that our relationship with Kaden will change, he will be welcome at youth group and community events, but all staff will stop going over and above trying to help him, as he was not fully invested in the help he received.

Vicar – Pr. Dana has interviewed two candidates. She asked Council whether revisiting this opportunity next year would be acceptable if these interviews don't produce an intern, Council agreed to revisit next year.
