

A letter from Pastor Dana...

Friends in Christ,

In these next weeks, we are knee-deep in serving our neighbors with Christmas Outreach and housing the homeless (ICRH)! Thank you for making these ministries run smoothly year after year. As we have witnessed throughout the years, these ministries make a difference in people's lives! If you're someone who has not had the opportunity to serve at either Christmas Outreach or ICRH, I pray this is the year the Spirit moves you to join us.


Speaking of opportunities, I am excited to share with you a few new things coming up on the horizon. The ICRH has made a big decision to spend the next few years transitioning from a rotational model to a permanent emergency shelter. This way, those experiencing houselessness will not have to move week after week. The ICRH is in the beginning phases of looking at property and buildings. This will take a great deal of fundraising, finding the right place, time, and other resources. ICRH has inquired about the 2.3 acres behind Immanuel Village that we own. I am taking steps to figure out the details and will work with ICRH and Immanuel Village to consider giving or selling our land. If you'd be interested in being at the table for this conversation, please reach out to me.

Speaking of being in the spirit of giving, we are already planning Advent and Christmas 2022! There are two new things to look forward to in the 2022 year. First, we will be hosting a brunch following the Lessons & Carols service on Dec 18. Second, since Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on Sundays this year, we are going to move worship to online only. We historically have low attendance on those days, so the worship ministry decided to take some of the positive learnings of the pandemic and move online. Since, many of you have plans for Christmas Day and New Year's Day, you don't even have to be in Mt. Pleasant to worship with us! You can join us in your pajamas from anywhere, and this also frees up our assisting ministers, ushers, altar guild, and musicians while our staff can be super creative with the worship service. I'm sure most of you remember my sermon from Podolsky's barn... so get those Christmas Day matching PJ's out and join us online!

Ministry with Each Other

Adult Theological Education - Linda Wicander

Our synod (the North/West Lower Michigan Synod) is excited to announce a new series of theological education courses! For five semesters beginning in Winter 2023, our synod will offer several six-week Zoom courses led by seminary professors. These courses are open to all adults, both laypeople and rostered ministers, and are free of charge.

The synod is starting the series off with a bang with a course on Paul taught by the Rev. Dr. Walter F. Taylor, Jr, Professor Emeritus of New Testament Studies at Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital university. Dr. Taylor taught regularly in the Lay Ministry Training program (the ELMM) and was very popular with the students. He is smart, funny, kind, compassionate, interesting, and knowledgeable!

This first course offering will be *Corinthian Correspondence: Conflict, Case Studies, Contemporary Congregations, and Christ.*

The goal of this six-week Zoom study is to learn from Paul and his house churches in the ancient Greek city of Corinth—both how they fell into conflict and how Paul sought to move them to reconciliation and ministry. The class sessions will also focus on problems facing believers today:

- how to deal with divisions within a congregation
- how to live together in a congregation in positive ways
- how to live as physical bodies
- how to live in intimate relationships
- who should lead congregations, including the roles of women and men
- how believers can look beyond themselves
- what really is the resurrection and how does it affect life today?

Each session will be self-contained so that participants could miss a week and still take part in later sessions. Are you concerned that you might have a time conflict but don't want to miss a class? The synod is exploring recording the sessions to make them available to registered participants who might have missed a session.


Resources for the sessions will be available on the synod's website.

The class will meet on six consecutive Tuesday evenings: January 10, 17, 24, 31; February 7, 14, 2023 from 7:00 – 8:15pm ET.

Sunday Morning Adult Study

Pastor Dana, following the 10 a.m. service invites you to a discussion on *How Lutherans Interpret the Bible*. We will meet in the Capital Room for 60 minutes each Sunday. This is a series of 20 minute videos that we will follow up with discussion.

You do not need to make every week. Each video in the series can stand alone.

Dr. Mark Allan Powell, is a Lutheran pastor and Bible professor at Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Columbus, Ohio. In this seven session video series Powell invites you to explore seven important questions about Lutherans and the Bible. He does not prescribe "the Lutheran way" to read the Bible nor does he dismiss the way you may have come to understand the Bible. Instead Powell presents a variety of Lutheran perspectives for interpreting the Bible. Through Powell's rich discussions you will discover answers to questions you have always had about the Bible.

Contributing Stocks or Bonds

Due to the tax changes that include a higher standard deduction and the elimination of the personal exemption, you may receive the best tax benefit if you donate directly from your retirement account.
