A Letter from Pr. Dana......

Siblings in Christ,

Time is an interesting notion. I've been experiencing it in so many ways these past 2 months. The whole month of January is a wash for me. I really don't remember most of it. February has lingered, as I long to get back to Sunday morning worship and routine. We all experience time differently depending on the circumstances. Standing in line at the grocery store for five minutes can seem like twenty. Sitting next to a loved one for five minutes can seem like two seconds. I'm sure you've heard the quote or have even stated it before, "time is relative."

A scientist would argue, what makes time relative starts with the assumption that the speed of light is the same for all observers...bear with me here. If a baseball was thrown by someone on a moving train, the speed of the ball depends upon the situation of the observer. A passenger on the train would rate the ball's speed one way, while someone on the ground, watching the train go by, would rate the ball at a different speed. The speed of light, then, must be relative, depending upon the speed of the observer.


Are you still with me? When we are standing in line at the grocery store, our mind is racing about everything else we could be doing. February, for me, has been slow because I keep thinking about what else I could or should be doing. When we're sitting with a loved one, our mind is in the present moment and not wandering onto the next task. In January, I was just surviving each moment.

These experiences change our state of mind. Just as the speed of the ball depends on the speed of the observer, the speed of our day depends on the state of our mind. In that moment, we can be anxious about the future or remain right there in the present moment.

So, as we spend this Lent seeking, my hope and prayer is that we can actually live in the moment. May we encounter God in each moment. May we soak up this Lenten season as we soak up sitting with a loved one. May this Lent draw you more deeply into the fullness of life, into the heart of God.



Contributing Stocks or Bonds

To contribute capital gain property such as stocks or bonds to the church, per IRS Publication 526 you can deduct the Fair Market Value of the asset on your personal tax returns - not the basis in the asset. Immanuel has a brokerage account to facilitate the transfer of these assets directly. If you are interested, please contact the church for information or assistance.

Tax Break for contributions - people over 70 1/2 years-old

If you are over 70.5 did you know that you can give directly from your retirement account to Immanuel Lutheran Church and no pay taxes on the gift? Due to the tax changes that include a higher standard deduction and the elimination of the personal exemption it is possible the best tax benefit for contributions to the church is to give directly from your retirement account.
