Contributing Stocks or Bonds

To contribute capital gain property such as stocks or bonds to the church, per IRS Publication 526 you can deduct the Fair Market Value of the asset on your personal tax returns - not the basis in the asset. Immanuel has a brokerage account to facilitate the transfer of these assets directly. If you are interested, please contact the church for information or assistance.

Tax Break for Contributions -people over 70 1/2 years-old

If you are over 70.5 did you know that you can give directly from your retirement account to Immanuel Lutheran Church and pay no taxes on the gift? Due to the tax changes that include a higher standard deduction and the elimination of the personal exemption, you may receive the best tax benefit if you donate directly from your retirement account.

Opening Devotion - Dana

5 minutes of positive talk

February Minutes – accepted as submitted.

Youth and Tech Coordinator Report – accepted as submitted

Pastor Report – accepted as submitted

Discussion regarding Immanuel hosting Dominic Thrasher in April. Pr. Dana wrote in support of Dominic on Immanuel's Facebook site.

Financial Report

Steve shared that he and Jan were able to get a 6-month CD at 5.25% and they moved 100,000 into a cd.

Discussion followed as to what to do with the profit. It was decided, Council will revisit this towards the end of the 6-month period.

Steve proposed that by using a Money Market Account in addition to the regular Checking Account, we could be earning 2.4%. He explained that the Account has enough fluidity that we could pay bills directly from Money Market without penalty. He and Jan asked Council for approval to take monies from the Checking Account and put it into the Money Market Account.

Motion from Mark – to approve the Treasurers taking monies from Checking Account and depositing into Money Market and moving money as necessary. The signatures for this will be Pr. Dana, Linda Wicander, and Steve and Jan Podolsky.

Staci seconded, motion carried

Old Business

Audit – Sarah is still talking with people and will report next month.

AED Training. Rachael explained that Josh Nelson, through his work with CMU, is taking a Train the Trainer Course in April and will become our AED point person.

Calendar – Beth put together a calendar and Linda will email this to Council.*

Council Retreat – April 27th. The Executive Committee is planning the retreat. Pr. Dana asked that creating budgets for the ministries be put on the agenda.

New Business

Synod Assembly is May 11th at Pr. Dana's house.

Council responsibilities, to ensure that budgets and mission vision are communicated with the Chairs of the Ministries. Ensure that Chairs are given their monthly budget. Jan and Steve offered to print up the last two years of each of the individual Ministry's budget and make available to the Chairs.*

Discussion and brainstorming about how to fund the Church in alternate ways. Pr. Dana asked that this be put on the retreat agenda.

Excellence in Service Awards – each ministry will nominate one person who will be given the award at the Annual Meeting.

Child Protection and nursery opportunities. Susan Stendal is working on updating the policy as well as offering a training. Roger Gilbert offered to help get the nursery up and running again.

New Council Members – Mark has agreed to another term. Council needs one person for next year.
