A letter from Pr. Dana....

Friends in Christ,

Last year during Advent, I was watching from afar, worn out after 6 rounds of chemo. I remember making a joke about writing a post during Advent while waiting for my results. But I never did. The waiting was simply too overwhelming. I was barely functioning, let alone writing. The fear that I might have to endure more rounds just to survive was terrifying.

I was supposed to learn the results 'officially' on December 27, but I'll never forget seeing them posted to MyChart, an app where you can read your medical results, around 3 P.M. on Christmas Eve: No Evidence Detected! That evening at worship, sitting with my big sister in the back pew, I reverted to being the annoying little sister— poking, tickling, and being silly. We ended up laughing uncontrollably. Others looked at us, but for me, it wasn't irreverent laughter; it was a laughter of relief and gratitude. In that pew with my sister, I felt like a kid with her whole life ahead of her again. I was living an advent in my own life.

Just a few weeks ago, I was back in that same sanctuary, worshiping in the back pew to celebrate Rev. David Sprang's retirement. I joined voices from across the synod to honor David as he begins a new advent in his life.

What are you watching and waiting for? It might be something as daunting as medical results or as joyful as the start of retirement. Mary, the mother of Jesus, experienced both joy and fear in her waiting. This Advent, I pray that you embrace whatever advent is unfolding in your life. And if it happens to be dark and frightening, remember:

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it. (John 1: 5)

This was truly an organic event where each part led to another part. We wanted to do Strategic Planning, realized Advent and Christmas were almost upon us and then in the New Year many of our Snowbirds would be gone. We wanted as many people as possible to participate so we came up with the idea to do the groups on a Sunday (with follow up in December for those who could not attend on the 17th). As we talked, we realized we might have guests who might not be interested in the Brainstorming groups so we planned a worship experience for them. Karen Graef said we will have young people here for the Choir and Chimes, so let's give them an opportunity to plan and dream. Thomas said what about the people who worship at home; this resulted in the plan to broadcast one of the groups with Thomas passing on the questions and comments. Someone asked what about the Campus Ministry which resulted in Josh and Rachel Nelson leading a group for them.

Somewhere in the planning process, the idea of the trees came up. A huge thank you to Beth Mundwiler for making all the leaves. Sarah Gilbert and I spent an hour at Max and Emily's spread out on two tables, sorting, counting and packing the leaves. Of course we were laughing the entire time.

And then our wonderful facilitators and scribes answered our call to be involved. They spent a morning in training, led the brainstorming groups and some will even come back on December 8 to do it all again.

Throughout all of this, Rachel Nelson kept us on track, she and Pastor Dana refined the questions, and she also conducted the training for facilitators and scribes.

I talked to a lot of people who are members of other churches. They were filled with joy when I shared the sequence, a perfect flow from the Word, to visioning and dreaming and returning for prayers and Holy Communion. A joyful way to spend a Sunday worship service in which we all came together to do God's will. I will never forget singing "Lift High the Cross" as we entered the Church. The Holy Spirit was reminding us of our past at the same time leading us to our future.

The council is grateful to all the scribes and facilitators for your willingness to lead us in this process! If you' missed the 17th, we will do follow-up brainstorming groups on Sunday, December 8 before and after worship. If you have to miss that too, there will be trees in the Narthex with questions and leaves. You can fill out your comments at any time before December 8. The strategic planning team will analyze the results of the brainstorming session. We will look for threads and in the New Year we will bring those insights back to the congregation. This is a lot of data to process so we will need time to analyze it. We hope to have something to share with the congregation by March 2025 at the latest. We are excited to see what the Spirit is up to here at Immanuel!

Contributing Stocks or Bonds

To contribute capital gain property such as stocks or bonds to the church, per IRS Publication 526 you can deduct the Fair Market Value of the asset on your personal tax returns - not the basis in the asset. Immanuel has a brokerage account to facilitate the transfer of these assets directly. If you are interested, please contact the church for information or assistance.

Tax Break for Contributions -people over 70 years-old

If you are over 72 did you know that you can give directly from your retirement account to Immanuel Lutheran Church and pay no taxes on the gift? Due to the tax changes that include a higher standard deduction and the elimination of the personal exemption, you may receive the best tax benefit if you donate directly from your retirement account.
